2024 Bronstein Faculty Research and/or Innovation Grant to Support Excellence in Dementia Care and/or Advance Care Planning Education

Application Deadline: November 6, 2023, 4:30 p.m.

The 2023-24 Bronstein Faculty Research and/or Innovation Grant to Support Excellence in Dementia Care and/or Advance Care Planning Education will fund faculty research at USI during the 2024-25 academic year. USI faculty will be eligible to apply for a competitive Research and/or Innovation Grant supporting excellence in dementia care and/or advance care planning. A total of \$5,000 in funding will be available and allocated through the competitive review of proposals by a selection committee. Funding faculty research and innovation promotes growth and development for faculty in these two areas of excellence.

As a grant requirement, faculty awarded will be required to share his/her project purpose and outcomes with students for three academic years. Materials, supplies, student workers, consultants, equipment and travel, faculty compensation as a stipend, overload or release time can be included in proposals. A grant of up to \$5,000 is available for faculty to initiate new basic or applied research or creative work, continue research or work in progress, or complete a project. A final report is due to the Provost/OSPR and Dr. Katie Ehlman by December 31, 2025.

Bigibility

- 1. Applicants must hold a full-time, tenured, or tenure-track position.
- 2. Bigible projects must be research, scholarship, or creative work conducted by faculty within the areas described above.
- 3. Applicants must be up to date on all reports from prior internal awards.

Note: While research involving students may be eligible for funding, the emphasis must be on faculty research. While students can be involved in the project, they should not be conducting the project.

Grant Information and Restrictions

Up to \$5,000 will be awarded for materials/ supplies, student workers, consultants, equipment and travel, faculty compensation as a stipend, overload or release time. Use of funds for travel are subject to the current US <u>travel polices</u>, which are subject to change. At this time international travel will be approved on a case-by-case basis. In some instances, travel might be approved, and other trips might not be approved

As an award requirement, faculty will be required to share their project purpose and outcomes with students at least once a year for four academic years.

Review Criteria

1. Scholarly significance to the field supported by in-

Does the proposal describe the plans for disseminating the creative work or research results? Conferences, journals or other outlets for dissemination should be specifically named/identified.

Budget

How appropriate, accurate, and justified is the budget and use of resources? How reasonable does the budget seem for both the effort and anticipated results described?

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6. Submit the proposal for routing through CAYUSE 424 no later than 4:30 p.m. on November 6, 2023.

Reporting Requirements

Recipients of the Faculty Research and Creative Work Grant are required to submit a final report summarizing the project to OSPR (sponsored.projects@usi.edu) and Dr. Katie Ehlman (mehlman@usi.edu) by December 31, 2025. Visit the OSPR website for final report guidelines. Recipients may be asked to present their research at a USI event.

Deadlines

Faculty Research and Creative Work Grant proposals are due no later than 4:30 p.m. on November 6, 2023, via CAYUSE424. Only electronic submissions through CAYUSE will be accepted.
